Planting and Cultural Care For Heucheras (Coral Bells)

Evergreen (in milder climates) and semi-evergreen mounding foliage Coral Bells are native to the woodlands and prefer well drained soil in sun or shade. Upright panicles of small bell-shaped flowers, which are attractive to bees and hummingbirds, bloom in a range of creamy whites, pinks and bright red. They usually bloom mid-spring through early summer. Some varieties are repeat bloomers. Heucheras provide year-round interest to garden beds, borders and containers. They are also useful as ground cover plants.

How to Grow Heucheras:

Heucheras are suitable for most gardens, being tolerant of a wide range of soil types from clay to sand. They prefer well-drained consistently moist soil, not wanting to be waterlogged or extremely dry. Full sun to partial shade is preferred; Heucheras grown in deep shade tend to lose their brilliant colours.




































To keep Heucheras looking their best, old flower spikes can be removed after flowering however it is best to cut-back and remove tired-looking foliage in spring. Heucheras can lift out of the ground over time, so lifting, dividing and replanting deeper with the crown just above the soil will re-invigorate old plants. Mulch afterwards with a layer of organic matter to protect the plants.

Fertilization, Diseases & Pests:





















Heucheras are not heavy feeders but will benefit from a light application of fertilizer in spring, use a fertilizer such as Home & Garden Excellence Evergreen. Mulching with a layer of Home & Garden Excellence Aged Bark, careful not to cover the center of the plant, will also help protect from moisture evaporation and vine weevil larvae damage, which can sometimes be a problem. Heucheras are not plagued with attacks from slugs or snails.

Heuchera rust can be a problem for some Heuchera, especially those with yellow, gold or orange foliage. It is prevalent in cool, damp spring conditions with lack of air circulation, it specific to Heucheras and does not spread to other plant types. Cutting back and removing the infected foliage along with applying an appropriate fungicide is the best control. Increased temperatures and drier summer conditions should slow the development as well. Do not water from overhead and water only during the day so that plants will have enough time to dry before night.







Name	Size (H x W)	Exposure	Description
Black Taffeta	12-14" x 14-16"	 	Shiny black foliage & large glossy leaves.
Caramel	6-8" x 12-14"	  	A robust grower with fuzzy, leaves that range in color from apricot to amber depending on light levels and temperature.
Dolce Cherry Truffles	8-10" x 26-30"	 	Bright red, heavily ruffled leaves for a low, mounding habit.
Dolce Frosted Berry	10-14" x 16-20"	 	Huge 5-6" silver leaves have charcoal veins. New leaves have a slight blush (or "frosting") to the leaves.
Dolce Silver Gumdrop	20-24" x 20-24"	 	Semi-glossy silver-purple leaves. Vibrant pink flowers in summer.
Dolce Spearmint	8-10" x 26-28"	 	Silvery-green leaves with dark green veins. Bicolour flowers have dark pink petal tips and light pink bases.
Dolce Toffee Tart	8-10" x 16-18"	 	Newest leaves are amber, and will mature to ginger during the summer. Creamy white flowers.
Dolce Wildberry	16-20" x 10-14"	 	Large, glossy purple leaves that keep their colour throughout summer. Light pink buds open to pure white flowers.
Dressed Up Ball Gown	10-12" x 24-28"	 	Huge glossy black leaves are incredibly ruffled and form a substantial habit. Large flower scapes hold pink buds that open to white flowers.
Dressed Up Evening Gown	12-14" x 20-24"	 	Huge glossy black leaves are incredibly ruffled and form a substantial habit. Large flower scapes hold pink buds that open to white flowers
Forever Purple	10-14" x 14-18"	 	Glossy, bright purple leaves. Flowers are a beautiful purple-pink color.
Forever Red	6-8" x 12-14"	 	The best red colour will be in cooler temperatures spring and fall. Spikes of small, white flowers appear in mid summer.
Green Spice	10-36" x 18-24"	 	Green leaves heavily overlaid with silver, featuring purple venation and dark gray edges.
Lime Rickey	8-24" x 12-24"	 	Glowing chartreuse in spring, turning lemon-lime in summer and forming a sturdy evergreen mound. Taller sprays of ivory flowers appear in late spring.
Northern Exposure Black	10" x 24"	 	Deep burgundy-purple rounded leaves with fluted edges form a tidy, dense mound.
Northern Exposure Lime	14-16" x 20-22"	 	Round, lime-green leaves that retain colour throughout the year.
Northern Exposure Purple	12" x 20"	 	Frilly, rounded, deep purple leaves develop iridescent silver tones

Name	Size (H x W)	Exposure	Description
Northern Exposure Red	12-14" x 18-20"	 	Dark red leaves retain their colour throughout the year. Especially bread for Northern gardens- takes winter better than other varieties.
Obsidian	10-20" x 12-16"	 	Darkest variety, which does not fade, even in full sun.
Palace Purple	12-24" x 12-18"	 	Dark purple leaves. Creamy-white flowers in summer. Perennial of year in 1991.
Plum Pudding	20-24" x 10-14"	 	Ruffled plum-purple foliage with silver marbling between the veins. Pink flowers. A favourite for many gardeners!
Primo Black Pearl	18-20" x 18-20"	 	Jet-black leaves with purple undersides. Incredibly dense habit. Tolerates both full shade or full sun.
Primo Mahogany Monster	12-16" x 22-28"	 	Huge mahogany-red leaves turn copper as they age. Light pink buds open to cream-white flowers.
Primo Peachberry Ice	8-10" x 30-34"	 	Large apricot-orange leaves with a silvery overlay. Colour is most prolific in spring and mellows with age. Creamy-white flowers.
Primo Pretty Pistachio	1-2' x 1-2'	 	Chartreuse lime-green foliage in a dense, compact form.
Primo Wild Rose	18-20" x 18-20"	 	Bright rosy-purple leaves with charcoal veins. Dark burgundy buds open to rose-pink flowers.
Shanghai	10-12" x 10-12"	 	Tight mounds of silvery-purple leaves set forth white flowers on dark stems.





Name	Size	Exposure	Description
Eye Spy	8-10" x 16-20"	 	Leaves emerge amber-yellow in spring and turn to lime green with rose centers in summer. Bright pink flowers.
Hopscotch	10-12" x 20-24"	 	Leaves emerge red in spring and change to deep green in summer and bronze-red in fall.
Red Rover	6-8" x 1-2'	 	Coppery-red, heavily lobed foliage. Foliage turns green in summer heat.

Name	Size	Exposure	Description
Cutting Edge	18-20" x 18-20"	 	Bright green leaves with dark burgundy centres. Creamy-white flowers.
Spring Symphony	8-10" x 8-10"	 	Deep green leaves with a black "star" pattern in the middle. Soft-pink flowers.

Name	Size	Exposure	Description
Sugar & Spice	8-12" x 12"	 	Masses of beautiful spikes of lightly-scented white bell-shaped flowers rising above the foliage from mid spring to mid summer.
