BLUEBERRIES		
Name	Information	Fruiting Time
3 in 1	3 different varieties in 1 pot. Perfect for patios or smaller gardens.	All Season
Blue Crop	A great blueberry plant for colder climates. Produces big clusters of large, all-purpose berries	Mid
Cabernet Splash	Producing delightful white flowers in the spring followed by plentiful sweet summer berries.	Mid
Chandler	Cold-hardy. Ripens in July. Self-pollinating.	Mid-late
Chippewa	Very cold hardy, medium sized fruit, firm & fine flavour	Mid
Duke	Vigorous, upright, productive, large/firm, mild flavour.	Early
Elliot	Large berries with exceptional flavour. Perfect for fresh eating or cooking.	Late
Jelly Bean	The foliage is unlike other blueberries and has unique, elongated, green leaves with highlights of red in cooler climates.	Mid
Northcountry	Produces clusters of blue round berries which are usually ready for picking in mid summer.	Mid
Northland	Features an abundance of magnificent blue berries from early to mid summer.	Early
Northblue	Sweet, dark blue berries. Very cold hardy.	Mid
Patriot	Exceptionally vigorous grower. Earliest of all Blueberries to fruit.	Early
Peach Sorbet	White bell-shaped flowers appear in spring, leading to an abundant summer crop of blueberries.	Mid
Perpetua	Produces two crops of blueberries, one in midsummer, and another in fall.	Mid to late
Pink Icing	Semi-evergreen. Breathtaking foliage colors and large, sweet berries.	Mid
Pink Lemonade	Very unique pink blueberries! Fruit is firm and sweet.	Mid to late
Top Hat	A very vigorous producer. Perfect for growing in containers.	Late

BLACKBERRIES - THORNLESS	
Name	Description
Baby Cakes	A dwarf, thornless blackberry perfect for patio pots with its compact habit
Chester	Produces large, very sweet, high quality berries that are juicy and have great flavour
Illini	An erect, self-fruitful, thorny shrub, which produces one crop of fruit per year.
Marion	Also known as Marionberry. The most used Blackberry commercially. Vigorous producer. Dark, sweet berries.
Snowbank	Translucent, milky-white in color but have all the flavor of a "normal" blackberry

CURRANTS	
Name	Information
Black Crandall	Large, sweet, black-blue currants that ripen late in the season.
Cherry	Bears heavy crops of beautiful, juicy, flavorful red berries. Great for fresh eating.

CURRANTS	
Name	Information
White	Large clusters of pink, red, white or black berries cascading down the heavily laden branches

GOOSEBERRIES	
Name	Information
Black Velvet	Produces a heavy crop of gorgeous red-black berries that have a sweet, blueberry-like-flavour.

Name	Description	Colour
Fiesta	Known for its ability to produce high quality raisins and its early fruit ripening	Green
Neptune	Disease-resistant. Resists cracking. Ripens in early September. Self-pollinating.	Green
Wine Making		
Cabernet Franc	A popular red winegrape. Can be considered the most suitable red <i>vinifera</i> variety in very cool climates.	Purple
Gruener Veltliner	Wines are typically finished dry and are peppery or spicy.	Green
Lemberger	Used to produce low acid, varietal wines.	Purple
Malbec	A thin skinned grape and needs more sun and heat	Purple
Merlot	A woody vine that is commonly grown for its edible qualities.	Purple
Sauvignon Blanc	Ripens mid-August to early September. The strong distinct flavor is used to make quality white table wines	Green

GOJI BERRIES	
Goji berries are one of the best berries for you! They are full of antioxidants. Plants are easy to care for- plant in full sun and stake for ease of harvest.	
Name	Description
Crimson Star	Bears fruit the year after planting. Produces large crops of tasty, large, bright red fruit.

HONEYBERRIES (HASKAPS)	
These very early ripening, tasty berries are hardy to -50 degrees C. Very easy to grow with no pest or disease problems. Two Varieties with similar bloom time are needed for pollination.	
Name	Description
Aurora	Large, sweet tasting berries that are easy to pick. Use to pollinate Borealis, Indigo Gem or Tundra. Ripens in mid summer.
Berry Blue	The most vigorous honeyberry. Can reach up to 8' in height. Bears an abundant crop of large, tasty, dark blue berries.
Cinderella	Sweet blue-purple berries in summer. Grows to 3' at maturity.
Honeybee	Excellent pollinizer variety that starts fruiting at a very early age.
Yezberry Honey Bunch	Very sweet fruit on a compact plant. Perfect for fresh eating or freezing. Use any other Yezberry series Haskap to pollinate.

## HONEYBERRIES (HASKAPS)

These very early ripening, tasty berries are hardy to -50 degrees C. Very easy to grow with no pest or disease problems. Two Varieties with similar bloom time are needed for pollination.



Name	Description
Yezberry Maxie	Delicious, juicy berries that taste like a cross between a raspberry and blueberry. Plant with Yezberry Solo to maximize production.
Yezberry Solo	Large, sweet berries that are great for fresh eating or making into sauces, jams or desserts. Plant with Yezberry Maxie to maximize production.
Yezberry Sugar Pie	The most compact growing Haskap. Fruit is large & sweet. Great for eating fresh and freezes well.

## HOPS

**There are two types of Hops used in home brewing:**

1. **Aroma: Lower in Alpha-acids and are used in conditioning and finishing.**
2. **Bittering: Higher in alpha-acids and are used to add bitterness**



Name	Description
Cascade	Aroma Hops. Vigorous grower that contributes fragrance and a light bitterness to home brews. Used to make West Coast style Craft Ales. Mildew resistant. Used Central City Brewers in their Red Racer 'Red Ale and 'White as well as by Trading Post Brewery in their 'Hop Session Lager' and 'Breakfast Stout'
Centennial	Floral and grapefruit notes. One of the best varieties for making home brew beer. Used for making IPAs and wheat beers. Used by Central City Brewers in their Red Racer IPA and Amber Ale.
Summer Shandy	This vine is more ornamental than other varieties., Leaves are bright yellow and retain their colour throughout the year. Less aggressive than other Hops.

## Kiwi

Name	Description
Actinidia arguta 'Anna'	Delicate white flowers in late spring. Sweet bite-sized fruit. Pest & disease resistant. Ripens in late summer. Requires a pollinator.
Actinidia arguta 'Issai'	Very vigorous grower. Self-fertile. Produces an abundance of small, delicious, smooth skinned fruit.
Actinidia arguta 'Prolifica'	Prolific is self-fertile and will independently yield delicious, grape-sized fruit.
Actinidia deliciosa 'Matua'	Kiwi deliciosa 'Matua' is a male that is ideal for pollinating all fuzzy kiwi types.
Actinidia deliciosa 'Saanichton'	A heavy producer of large, sweet and flavorful fruit.
Actinidia kolomikta 'Arctic Beauty'	Beautiful white & pink variegated foliage. Very fragrant flowers. Use to pollinate September Sun Kiwi.
Actinidia kolomikta 'September Sun'	Beautiful variegated foliage & fragrant white flowers. Use Artic Beauty or Pasha to pollinate to get fruit.

## Pomegranate

Name	Description
Parfianka	Glossy-leaved, ornamental and long-lived tree with showy orange-red blossoms in late spring.
Salavatski	Very large pale red fruit, with red arils and sweet/tart juice. Very cold hardy and very productive.
Wonderful	A fast-growing tree that delivers delicious fruit in huge, abundant harvests

RASPBERRIES	
Summer Bearing	
Name	Description
Honey Queen	Bears fruit on its prior year's growth. The delicious yellow berries appear in summer.
Raspberry Shortcake	Compact, with a rounded growth habit, and it thrives in a patio pot or in the landscape.
Williamette	Large, dark red, medium acid. Heavy producer. Old standard and once most widely planted in the world. Ripens in June.
Boyne	An early-season variety that is extremely winter hardy. It consistently produces deep-red, medium-sized berries.
Munger Black	Strong, stout canes yield large, firm, and juicy berries — great for making jams or jellies, or eating fresh.
Red Bounty	Large and flavourful, excellent for fresh eating and great for processing.
Squamish	Conical shaped, very bright and glossy in appearance and medium red in colour.
Everbearing	
Name	Description
Amity	Large, dark red berries with beautiful flavour.
Chemainus	The fruit is red, sweet and tart, and some varieties ripen in Summer
Glencoe	A self-fertile cross between a black raspberry and a red raspberry
Heritage	Late Season, yields flavourful medium sized red fruit, very vigorous, winter hardy, disease resistant
Jewel	Produces excellent yields of superb quality berries. The fruit is glossy black in color, a large size, and has a rich raspberry flavor.
Saanich	Produces a very high yield of medium-sized, firm, sweet fruit

RHUBARB	
Name	Description
Crimson Cherry	The reddest rhubarb variety. It produces brightly colored red stalks with the unique characteristic of being red throughout under normal temperature and moisture conditions.
Victoria	Needs lots of sun, but will produce in a lightly shaded area. Easy to grow and makes delicious pies!

Elderberry	
Name	Description
Nova	Slightly shorter than many <i>S. canadensis</i> varieties, it's a great choice for smaller or urban gardens.
Ranch	Semi-spur-bearing plant, which means lots of production. Has an upright vs. bushy growth habit.
Wyldewood	Green lance-shaped foliage surrounds huge 12" white-petaled flower heads that bloom with a lemony scent in midsummer, followed by rich purple berries.

York	Known for its huge production of large berries, but not necessarily the sweetest.

<b>MISCELLANEOUS</b>	
<b>Name</b>	<b>Description</b>
Aronia 'Viking' (Chokeberry)	Open, upright, spreading, somewhat rounded but leggy, suckering, deciduous shrub that typically grows 3-6' tall
Boysenberry	A cross between a Blackberry, Raspberry, Loganberry & Dewberry. Juicy, deep purple berries that can grow to be over 1" long. Great for fresh eating or jams & jellies.
Feijoa sellowiana (Pineapple Guava)	Both fruit & flowers are edible! Tasty guava-like fruit ripens in late fall. Pineapple Guava requires protection in winter.
Hippophae rhamnoides 'Hergo'	A large, slow-growing, deciduous shrub with an upright, suckering habit
Jostaberry 'Red'	Produces large, dark red, sweet fruit. Fruit can be harvested in early July. Berries are great for fresh eating, jams, jellies and sauces.
Jostine	Jostine Jostaberry is a vigorous black currant and gooseberry hybrid that produces medium to large berries with excellent flavor and very high yields.
Loganberry	Large, cone-shaped dark red berries that are extremely juicy, with a tart, rich flavour.
