<b>Name</b>	<b>Information</b>	<b>Fruiting Time</b>
3 in 1	3 different varieties in 1 pot. Perfect for patios or smaller gardens.	All Season
Blue Crop	A great blueberry plant for colder climates. Produces big clusters of large, all-purpose berries	Mid
Chippewa	Very cold hardy, medium sized fruit, firm & fine flavour	Mid
Duke	Vigorous, upright, productive, large/firm, mild flavour.	Early
Elliot	Large berries with exceptional flavour. Perfect for fresh eating or cooking.	Late
Northblue	Sweet, dark blue berries. Very cold hardy.	Mid
Northcountry	Self-pollinating but will yield larger crops if pollinated with Northblue.	Early
Northland	The hardiest of the half-high highbush blueberries. Must be paired with another suitable blueberry variety because it is not self-pollinating.	Early to Mid
Patriot	Exceptionally vigorous grower. Earliest of all Blueberries to fruit.	Early
Pink Lemonade	Very unique pink blueberries! Fruit is firm and sweet.	Mid to late
Polaris	Delicate, sweet flavour. Very aromatic and sweet.	Early
Reka	Produces early-ripening, medium-sized berries with an exceptionally rich flavor and pleasing aroma.	Early
Top Hat	A very vigorous producer. Perfect for growing in containers.	Late

<b>BLACKBERRIES - THORNLESS</b>	
<b>Name</b>	<b>Description</b>
Chester	Produces large, very sweet, high quality berries that are juicy and have great flavour
Marion	Also known as Marionberry. The most used Blackberry commercially. Vigorous producer. Dark, sweet berries.
Navaho	Thornless, easy care variety yields exceptionally sweet berries. Tolerates clay soil and returns each year.
Prime Ark Traveler	Produces medium-large berries, with good yields. Berries are with good flavor and sweetness and lower acidity
Snowbank	Translucent, milky-white in color but have all the flavor of a "normal" blackberry
Sweetie Pie	Berries are medium size and glossy with an excellent flavor and high sugar content

<b>CURRANTS</b>	
<b>Name</b>	<b>Information</b>
Black Crandall	Large, sweet, black-blue currants that ripen late in the season.
Cherry Red	Large red clusters in summer. Fruit is perfect for jams, jellies or sauces. Can be eaten fresh as well.
Primus White	Large clusters of pink, red, white or black berries cascading down the heavily laden branches

Black Velvet	Boasts high yields of large, dessert quality, dark red fruit. The plants are vigorous and very disease resistant.
Pixwell	Heavy producer of pale green fruit.

Canadice	This early ripening grape is known to bear great crops even after hard winters. Sweet, great grape flavor with a unique hint of spiciness.	Red
Concord	Exceptional hardiness, vigor and disease resistance. Heat-tolerant. Ripens in late September. Self-pollinating.	Purple
Einset	The flesh is tender to firm with a fruity strawberry-like flavour.	Red
Emerald	The flesh is tender to firm with a fruity strawberry-like flavour.	Yellow/ Green
Fiesta	Known for its ability to produce high quality raisins and its early fruit ripening	Green
Glenora	An easy to grow variety producing strikingly long clusters	Dark Blue
Himrod	This self pollinating variety produces sweet, medium sized grapes	Yellow
Interlaken	Sweet, firm, tight skinned seedless fruit. Ripens earlier than most grapes. Great for fresh eating, juices or wine.	Green
Neptune	Disease-resistant. Resists cracking. Ripens in early September. Self-pollinating.	Green
Red Flame	Produces medium-sized clusters of large, sweet, juicy grapes. Seedless. Heat-tolerant and ideally suited for southern gardens. Ripens in August. Self-pollinating.	Red

Sovereign Coronation	Seedless, blue-purple fruit with a sweet musky flavour.	Purple
Steuben	A very productive and hardy grape, featuring large sweet bright blue fruit in fall	Blue
Vanessa	High quality seedless grape, mild sweet flavour. Harvest in late September.	Red

Cabernet Franc	A popular red winegrape. Can be considered the most suitable red <i>vinifera</i> variety in very cool climates.	Purple
Cabernet Sauvignon	One of the world's most widely recognized red wine grape varieties that can be grown in a diverse spectrum of climates	Purple
Campbell Early	An early-ripening, seeded, Concord-type grape	Purple
Gewurztraminer	Makes wines that are typically full-bodied and ripe, with high alcohol and relatively low acidity	Pink
Gruner Veltliner	Wines are typically finished dry and are peppery or spicy.	Green
Lemberger	Used to produce low acid, varietal wines.	Purple
Malbec	A thin skinned grape and needs more sun and heat	Purple
Merlot	A woody vine that is commonly grown for its edible qualities.	Purple
Pinot Noir	Widely considered to produce some of the finest wines in the world	Purple
Riesling	Relatively cold hardy. Makes excellent quality still and sparkling wines.	Green

Big Lifeberry	Produces extra-large fruit, perfect for using fresh in savoury recipes. Performs well in patio pots.
Crimson Star	Bears fruit the year after planting. Produces large crops of tasty, large, bright red fruit.

Name	Description
Aurora	Large, sweet tasting berries that are easy to pick. Use to pollinate Borealis, Indigo Gem or Tundra. Ripens in mid summer.
Berry Blue	The most vigorous honeyberry. Can reach up to 8' in height. Bears an abundant crop of large, tasty, dark blue berries.
Cinderella	Sweet blue-purple berries in summer. Grows to 3' at maturity.
Honeybee	Very fast growing and produces fruit at a young age. Great pollinator plant for Tundra and Borealis variety.
Yezberry Honey Bunch	Very sweet fruit on a compact plant. Perfect for fresh eating or freezing. Use any other Yezberry series Haskap to pollinate.
Yezberry Maxie	Delicious, juicy berries that taste like a cross between a raspberry and blueberry. Plant with Yezberry Solo to maximize production.
Yezberry Solo	Large, sweet berries that are great for fresh eating or making into sauces, jams or desserts. Plant with Yezberry Maxie to maximize production.
Yezberry Sugar Pie	The most compact growing Haskap. Fruit is large & sweet. Great for eating fresh and freezes well.



## HOPS

**There are two types of Hops used in home brewing:**

1. **Aroma:** Lower in Alpha-acids and are used in conditioning and finishing.
2. **Bittering:** Higher in alpha-acids and are used to add bitterness

Name	Description
Cascade	Aroma Hops. Vigorous grower that contributes fragrance and a light bitterness to home brews. Used to make West Coast style Craft Ales. Mildew resistant. Used Central City Brewers in their Red Racer 'Red Ale' and 'White as well as by Trading Post Brewery in their 'Hop Session Lager' and 'Breakfast Stout'
Centennial	Floral and grapefruit notes. One of the best varieties for making home brew beer. Used for making IPAs and wheat beers. Used by Central City Brewers in their Red Racer IPA and Amber Ale.
Chinook	Pine and grapefruit notes. Used to make American-style Pale Ales or lagers. Used by Steamworks Brewery in their Pale Ale.
Nugget	Bittering Hops. A very strong, bitter Hop. Used for making Stouts and Ales. Used by Dead Frog Brewery in their 'Commander Imperial Stout'.
Summer Shandy	This vine is more ornamental than other varieties., Leaves are bright yellow and retain their colour throughout the year. Less aggressive than other Hops.



<b>Pomegranate</b>	
<b>Name</b>	<b>Description</b>
Parfianka	Glossy-leaved, ornamental and long-lived tree with showy orange-red blossoms in late spring.
Salavatski	Very large pale red fruit, with red arils and sweet/tart juice. Very cold hardy and very productive.
Wonderful	A fast-growing tree that delivers delicious fruit in huge, abundant harvests

<b>RASPBERRIES</b>	
<b>Summer Bearing</b>	
<b>Name</b>	<b>Description</b>
Black Jewel	Rich, black fruit is perfect for fresh eating, pies or preserves. Very heavy producer.
Boyne	Beautifully sweet berries in summer. Excellent for fresh eating, deserts and jams.
Williamette	Large, dark red, medium acid. Heavy producer. Old standard and once most widely planted in the world. Ripens in June.
<b>Everbearing</b>	
<b>Name</b>	<b>Description</b>
Amity	Large, dark red berries with beautiful flavour.
Caroline	Produces two bumper crops of sweet, firm berries. (Late June & Late August)
Chilcotin	A high yielding variety cropping early and then again late in the season. Canes produce sweet red fruit during Summer.
Fall Gold	Late season, produces golden yellow medium sized red fruit, very vigorous, winter hardy, disease resistant
Heritage	Late Season, yields flavourful medium sized red fruit, very vigorous, winter hardy, disease resistant

<b>RHUBARB</b>	
<b>Name</b>	<b>Description</b>
Stawberry Red	Bright red stems and a milder flavour than the old-fashioned greener stemmed types.

<b>MISCELLANEOUS</b>	
<b>Name</b>	<b>Description</b>
Boysenberry	A cross between a Blackberry, Raspberry, Loganberry & Dewberry. Juicy, deep purple berries that can grow to be over 1" long. Great for fresh eating or jams & jellies.
Jostaberry 'Black Velvet'	Sweet, reddish-black fruit with an delicious, complex flavor
Jostaberry 'Jostine'	Very vigorous growing. Produces black-red berries that can be harvested in July.

**MISCELLANEOUS**

<b>Name</b>	<b>Description</b>
Feijoa sellowiana (Pineapple Guava)	Both fruit & flowers are edible! Tasty guava-like fruit ripens in late fall. Pineapple Guava requires protection in winter.
Jostaberry 'Red'	Produces large, dark red, sweet fruit. Fruit can be harvested in early July. Berries are great for fresh eating, jams, jellies and sauces.
Tayberry	A cross between blackberry and raspberry. The long canes produce large red-purple berries. Very vigorous producer.
