Why Plant Native Plants?

There are so many benefits to planting species that have been in our region forever!

1. **Adapted to Our Climate:** These species thrive in our local weather conditions, including rainfall and temperature fluctuations.
2. **Low Maintenance:** These plants require less water and fertilizer (once established) compared to non-native plants.
3. **Supports Wildlife:** They provide food and shelter for native birds, pollinators, and other wildlife.
4. **Erosion Control:** Some of these species have Deep root systems which help to stabilize soil and prevent erosion.
5. **Resilient to Pests/Diseases:** Evolved defenses make them less susceptible to local pests and diseases.

Secrets to Success:

1. Follow our planting guide, that can be found here:
2. Amend the soil with Home & Garden Mushroom Manure before planting.
3. Apply 2-3" of Home & Garden Aged Bark Mulch to retain moisture and suppress weeds. The bark also adds nutrients back into the soil as it decomposes.
